1. Apologies

Apologies for absence were received from Cllrs M Laity, A Harris and S Lock.

2. Members to declare personal & prejudicial interests (incl details thereon) re any items on this agenda and any dispensations thereon previously granted or requested now

Chairman – item 12 - landowner

3. Public questions (**15 minutes in total – 2 minutes each - to speak on agenda item or raise a new subject**). **This is your only chance to speak unless invited to do so elsewhere by the Chairman.**

A member of the public re-iterated his request for Cornwall Council to look into traffic calming measures for Rosevear and a footway around the bend between Parc Vro and the next property down Rosevear Hill. He advised that raised kerbs would be placed outside the boundary wall of Rosevear Bridge Cottage to deflect water from the hill going into the garden. It was noted.

4. To receive Cornwall Cllr Julian Rand's report.

Cornwall Cllr Julian Rand had attended CORSERV and WLAG meetings amongst others, the latter group was about to start its CLLD funding programme. He had also met with the Planning Enforcement team to establish whether there was a given length of time for such cases to be investigated and closed but there was not. Each case was dealt with on its own merits and would take as long as it took to negotiate with the owner, put in planning, and go to appeal, etc so that every possible avenue had been pursued with them before eventually taking them to court if that was how far it got. A further issue had recently arisen where, due to data protection, an owner complained

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that their name had been revealed in reports to Parish Councils on monthly activities so now the enforcement team would not be able to correspond with Parish Councils other than to advise of an enforcement case number and when the case was closed. This was extremely frustrating for Parish Councils who did not receive much information as it was already. Cornwall Council was undertaking a £20m IT upgrade to try and create one universal system instead of the over 200 different types of software it presently used. A member requested that he ensured the present excellent online mapping system was retained and not replaced by the system for online reporting of potholes, etc as it was far inferior. It was noted. He had also attend a Fire Services briefing, which had a far better community approach than the Police. As for the proposed music festival to be held in Mawgan parish; the event organiser had spoken to him and explained what measures would be taken to eliminate noise. Apparently, out of 2 music festivals that had been held on the site in the recent past, one of which was noisy and one which was not, his was the not noisy one. Cornwall Cllr Julian Rand's report was noted.

There seemed to be less bunting and a charge for the bingo night had been entered in the owl leaflet when there should be no charge. It was felt bunting at Parc Vro would be more visible and let people know that something was going on. Phil Greet's van hid things that were going on further down that side of the field. The Chairman thanked everyone who had helped in any way (both Cllrs and the public) on the day including the marshals, tea ladies, people who put up and took down the marquee, etc. A Feast Week Committee was required.

11. To receive update with regard to defibrillator provision in Parish

The data from the solar cabinet pilot scheme during the winter was still being analysed. The Rose-in-Bush one had been fitted to the kiosk and free paint had been received for the refurbishment of the kiosk.

12. playground equipment installation for Glebe play area now complete

This was now complete. A check would be made as to whether the picnic table had been installed, as it had left the donor's property.

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13. Notice of music festival to be held at Chygarkye

This was in a different spot to the boom box event that was very loud. It was 2 fields further from St Martin, where it was heard most before and in a valley so hopefully sound would not travel so far. Bales, etc were being stacked around to dampen the noise, as well as sound monitoring equipment and a hotline phone number being activated during the event. It was noted.
