1. Apologies

No apologies were received.

3. Public questions (**15 minutes in total – 2 minutes each - to speak on agenda item or raise a new subject**). **This is your only chance to speak unless invited to do so elsewhere by the Chairman.**

There were no complaints from Rosevear residents but congratulations for the recently re-surfaced roundabout in Mawgan and the speed at which it was done. Cormac did not use all of the allotted time. It was noted.

4. To receive Cornwall Cllr Julian Rand's report.

First of all Cornwall Cllr Julian Rand wished to point out that it was his son-in-law who was a member of the Chemical Brothers, not his brother-in-law as stated in the February minutes. This was noted and corrected. On Cornwall Council business; he had attended budget meetings where there were 4 alternatives – 2 labour and 2 conservative. 1 was for an extra 1% on Council Tax to pay for social services; the 4<sup>th</sup> alternative was for more money in the general reserve as it was getting low. Labour Cllr Kirkham's alternative was not to do that and take some money out for education, social welfare and health (Making Integration Happen). On a vote it was 54 to 53, with Cllr Rand being challenged for having abstained and causing such a close vote. Today Cornwall Cllr Julian Rand had attended the second meeting of the Goonhilly master plan panel that included representatives of the AONB, NE, Cornwall Wildlife Trust, an architect, Piran Trezize of GES Ltd and Sandra Rothschild ex of SWRDA now a standalone consultant advising Goonhilly. Also during the month Cornwall Cllr Julian Rand had met with Cornwall Cllr Geoff Brown (Portfolio holder for transport) when he discussed items such as traffic calming at Rosevear, which would be looked at and extending the 30mph speed limit at Garras into the present 40mph. The report was noted.

It was RESOLVED that the Chairman sign the minutes as a true and correct account of the previous meeting.

Cllr Vivian Benney had reported online; flooding in Skyburriowe Lane between Skyburriowe Farm and Burnoon and the answer came back that it had been looked at and was not too bad.

The window of The Ancient Order of Foresters lodge at Garras was getting wider open.

Parking at Garras was overshooting Tregear Farm entrance causing a nuisance for the farmer. A traffic management truck was taking up a lot of space and it was wondered why it did not get taken back to the depot after work. Double yellow lines were suggested.

Parking both outside and opposite Garras School was a serious problem with parents still doing it despite appeals from the School. Extending double yellow lines on the opposite side was suggested. It was agreed a letter be sent to the school about this.

The Chairman had advised Gwarth-an-Drea Farm about the mud problem.
